

## **First Fleeters Week 2022**

### **Discover their lives with special tours and activities**

The 06 March 1788 arrival on Norfolk Island of Commandant Phillip Gidley King and a small group of convicts and free settlers began the second settlement of the NSW Colony. Centred around an evocative re-enactment of their landing on that day, this week offers the chance to discover some of the lesser known aspects of life from the time including how you may, or may not (!) have survived from illness or accident due to medical facilities and skills on hand.

Discovering how convict life has been portrayed at earlier times will be entertainingly gained through a screening of the 1927 version of the movie *For the Term of His Natural Life*. Marcus Clarke's 1874 novel about the convict system in Australia is widely regarded as a classic of Australian literature and the film was the most expensive Australian silent film ever made and remains one of the most famous films of the silent era.

A direct descendant of Clarke's, Peter Clarke, lived on Norfolk Island for many years. Peter was also a successful and prolific writer of books, lyrics and, in his advertising career, jingles (Do you remember 'Oh, of Razamatazz', 'Lipton Jigglers' and 'BIC, better by a Mile?'). Peter wrote the play *The Trial of the Fifteen* that has been continuously performed on Norfolk Island for over 30 years.

Other tours include *Settlement Secrets* focusing on convict Kingston remains with emphasis on the human experience through history telling; and Norfolk Island Museum tag-A-Long tour and museum pass.
