165th Anniversary of the arrival of the Pitcairn Islanders

On the 8th June 1856, the 'Morayshire' arrived on Norfolk where they were met by the Commissariat Storekeeper and his wife. This day became 'Bounty Day', also known as 'Anniversary Day' and it is celebrated every year by the Norfolk community. Visitors are welcome to absorb the local culture, embodied through the local 'Norf'k language (a mix of Tahitian and old English), food, crafts and customs.

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'Bounty' / 'Anniversary' Day 2021

The 8th of June 2021 will mark the 165th anniversary of the Pitcairn Islanders arriving to Norfolk Island.

The Pitcairners were of course, the descendants of the English sailors of 'mutiny on the *Bounty*' fame and the Tahitian women who, under their leader Fletcher Christian, began a new life on isolated Pitcairn Island. After outgrowing tiny Pitcairn the community, made up of eight family groupings, relocated to Norfolk Island where their descendants still live today.

On the Day:

In the morning you will be picked up to join the *Bounty* Mutineer descendants as they reenact the landing of their forebears. The landing takes place at the Kingston Pier, the oldest pier in the Southern Hemisphere.

You can follow the procession of the *Bounty* Mutineer descendants who will be dressed in their period costume to the Cenotaph, where hymns are sung and respects paid to fallen heroes. Then it is on to the Cemetery, where wreaths are laid, local hymns and the Pitcairn Anthem (Norfolk Island's national anthem) are sung. The *Bounty* Mutineer descendants then make their way to the All Saints Church for the judging of the best dressed families.

You can observe the tradition of the children of the *Bounty* Mutineer descendants rolling down the Government House hill. Then it's off for morning tea followed by a traditional Island picnic lunch. Before lunch the Norfolk grace will be sung. You will sample some traditional Norfolk 'wetles' and enjoy complimentary red and white wine, orange juice, tea and coffee.
